DCI Lou Wall		West Mercia Police have delivered Look Beyond the Obvious training to all staff alongside the DA Matters training to enhance recognition of risk indicators, improve risk assessments and recording. The Force is shifting its approach to become more 'trauma informed' but this is a significant cultural change to Policing. Officers attending incidents have access to intelligence to inform holistic risk assessments via laptops. However, it is recognised that deployment to immediate response situations does not afford staff the opportunity to use these. As a result intelligence can be conveyed directly via radio from OCC who have access to the full range of intelligence. In due course an upgrade is planned to our OCC Command and Control Saab Safe. This will provide integration to our Intelligence systems so that responding staff should be able to see updates and access intelligence on their hand held mobile phones. Completed March 2023
