# **Public Art Commission Brief – Appendix B**

### Schedule of possible locations for S106 public art installation

A number of potential location options around the site have been identified, these are set out below with images and notes and lastly mapped on site plan. You may wish to focus on one, propose a concept for multiple locations, or present ideas for more than one location. With the steering group and as part of the commissioning process the location choice and installation option deemed best will be worked through.

- 1. SEVERN STREET GATEWAY TO SITE, see also Portland Street gateway at other end of site Flower beds, gateway pillars, Museum and Royal Porcelain Works buildings; planting scheme could be adapted with approval of site partners; Museum of Royal Worcester signwriting to remain visible
- A high visibility location with scope for a range of installation options including freestanding
- Could function to raise profile and welcome visitors into the heritage site, visible from both sides









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- 2. HERITAGE BUILDING WALLS AROUND THE COURTYARD PERIMETER
  Brick walls of Museum of Royal Worcester and Royal Worcester Works buildings with approval of
  owners and any tenants would need to be attractive and in keeping with the character of the site
- Visibility in a leisure dwell-time destination, could function to tie together different buildings on-site
- detailed work can be observed close-up, tactile elements and/or words could be used effectively














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#### 3. CENTRAL PLANTING BED

Note that a large teapot framework public art object 2m wide x 1.5m tall is scheduled to be installed during Summer 2023 in the section projecting towards Museum of Royal Worcester; partners wish to retain views towards the Henry Sandon Hall steps and doors from many vantage points in courtyard

- A high visibility location that could be a statement/focal point for a freestanding work
- Significantly constrained by needing to work with already commissioned public art sculpture





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#### 4. HENRY SANDON HALL SIDE WALL AND/OR ROOF PERIMETER

With agreement and approval of Royal Porcelain Works trustees, rendered wall and roofline outside maintenance access walkway; must permit ongoing maintenance of historic structure and not interfere with function of vehicle parking spaces. Viewpoint is in a shared vehicle/pedestrian access area.

- Large area could be used to create visual impact, signpost/celebrate the heritage of the wider site
- Would require a solution that permits the maintenance and preservation of this structure with which there are ongoing challenges
- Consideration to be given to risks of viewing in an area open to vehicle access





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#### 5. ST. PETER'S COURT, KING STREET GATEWAY INTO SITE

With approval from Berkeley Homes paved area with large tree planters adding greenery, shared vehicle and pedestrian access into/out of site from King Street/Princes Drive housing development; expected to be the site of a heritage interpretation board which may be most appropriate addition.

- Important heritage location–former site of St Peter's church, taken down in 19th C
- Artwork could add focal point and character to a relatively sterile location
- Vehicles enter and leave past this point at some speed, emergency vehicle and parking access need to be considered





#### 6. SMALL COURTYARD AREA OFF PRINCES DRIVE BY CANAL

With the approval of Berkeley Homes and local residents/businesses a paved area with canalside visibility surrounded by heritage buildings.

- An intimate space away from vehicle access routes that could create a community/visitor gathering/dwell space; seating, paving or bollard structures could be used
- Much less visible location probably a more resident-focussed installation meeting community needs than a focal point for heritage visitors







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#### 7. PORTLAND STREET GATEWAY TO SITE

With approval of local residents/Berkeley Homes/new acquirer of remaining undeveloped elements of the site, building walls and paving could be used. One side is an historic structure needing redevelopment so possibly challenging; vehicle and pedestrian access needs to be maintained.


- Important gateway boundary into heritage site that is not currently well-marked
- Could visually echo in a lower-key way a more prominent installation at Severn Street gateway
- Social and industrial history of the site could be highlighted
